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HOME GROUND HABITATS

I founded Home Ground Habitats in 2011; it is now a 501(c)(3) not-profit operating as a native plant nursery and educational facility, a model of social enterprise with a local focus, where volunteers propagate both plants and ideas for a new paradigm in home landscaping. Since our founding, Home Ground Habitats has donated California natives and habitat plants, seeds, and educational materials to more than fifteen schools in Marin County, and provided on-going support to several community and public gardens and open space restoration projects throughout the county. In addition, it provides plants in support of fund-raising activities of other non-profit organizations such as the Marin chapter of the California Native Plant Society.

Over the years, I have taught my volunteers what I know so they flourish along with our plants. I have also given or hosted innumerable public lectures and hands-on demonstrations on subjects ranging from pruning natives, installing irrigation systems, home composting, seed collecting, and insects and butterflies in the garden, to traditional uses of California native plants.

MARIN ART & GARDEN CENTER – 2001 to 2009

Garden Education Manager and Volunteer Coordinator

I created this position at the Marin Art and Garden Center; I joined the Garden Society of Marin, one of the founding organizations, but soon came to realize that while there was plenty of art being promoted at the Center, there was nothing going on in the gardens—eleven acres of wonderfully unique and beautiful public space. I made a proposal to the Board of Directors to build and maintain the gardens while engaging and educating members and visitors on an eco-friendly approach to land stewardship. While there:

• I recruited, trained and managed youth interns, service-learning groups, and adult volunteers who helped design and build California native plant and butterfly demonstration gardens, a nursery, a composting demo site, and rainwater harvesting systems.

• In collaboration with volunteer groups, I created and delivered numerous educational and hands-on programs on nature and gardening for children and adults.

• I successfully sought out sponsors and grant funding for many of these programs.

NATURALIST and EDUCATOR

Watershed Approach to Landscaping book, 2018. Hired by Marin Municipal Water District as the local consultant for this influential book that encourages a new and much more ecofriendly approach to home landscaping practices

Watershed Approach to Landscaping educational classes. Fall 2019 – resuming in Spring of 2021. Originated a six-part series of classes through College of Marin Community Education, together with my colleague, Teliha Draheim, teaching the principles of eco-friendly gardening using MMWD's WAL book as the textbook.

Native Plant Propagation Classes. 2016–2019. Taught a series of plant propagation classes each summer. Sponsored by Marin Resource Conservation District, Pt. Reyes National Seashore, and PRNSA

Teacher Workshops in collaboration with SPAWN, 2017–2019. Representing the Marin

chapter of CNPS, and working together with Audrey Fusco, SPAWN's nursery manager, we developed free workshops for elementary level teachers interested in bringing nature to school. Subjects included plants for habitats, butterfly and pollinator gardens, composting with worms, site and soil preparation, and propagating native plants. We supported these teachers and schools with on-site consultations and donations of supplies and plants.

Creating Wildlife-Friendly Gardens, 2005 to present. Classes taught at Tilden Regional Parks, SF Botanical Garden, Pt. Reyes Field Institute, Pepperwood Preserve, Sonoma State Sustainable Landscape Professional Certificate Program, and North Marin Water District **Marin Master Gardeners Continuing Education Classes**, 2017 to present. California Naturalist Training

Programs and Presentations, 2005 to present. Numerous presentations given on gardening for butterflies and creating habitat to groups such as California Native Plant Society, Audubon Society, The Gardens at Heather Farms, Inverness Garden Club, Santa Rosa Garden Club, Healdsburg Garden Club, Novato Garden Club, and many more

Home Composting Education, 2005–2015. Taught hands-on classes for ZeroWaste Marin. I initiated their compost bin subsidy program for Marin residents.

Marin County Fair, 2010 to present. I serve as a Compost Judge

Bay-Friendly Gardening classes at MAGC, 2007 to 2009. I took the training courses, including a special Master Composter's Course, and then taught the same courses at MAGC. Sponsored by Marin Municipal Water District.

College of Marin Community Education Classes. 2006 to 2009. I developed and taught classes, many offered off-site at MAGC, on gardening for bees, butterflies and birds, seed collecting and plant propagation, and home composting.

COMMUNITY PROJECTS

California Native Pollinator Garden at the Bay Model Visitor Center, US Army Corps of Engineers. A project of the Marin chapter of CNPS, initiated by myself and Laura Lovett, Gardening with Natives Co-Chairs, in 2018, to create a showpiece garden of California natives in a very public place, with the goal of showing people how beautiful they can be and to encourage the use of natives in private home gardens. Garden bed is over 100 feet long and includes plant groupings to support butterflies, hummingbirds, songbirds, native bees, and monarch butterflies. The project included extensive interface with the US Army Corps staff to develop the site and collaborate on its care and upkeep.

fostered broods of these babies, providing dead baby mice every evening until the owlets fledged.
